SCHEDULE Exhibition Rules

1. One entry only per exhibitor per class
2. Exhibits in all classes MUST be the work of the exhibitor and/or been in his/her possession for at least two months
3. The Judges' decision is FINAL in all cases
4. Exhibitors in the Flower and Floral Art sections must provide own containers
5. The Committee will take every possible care of all exhibits but will not be liable or held responsible for any breakages or damage to said exhibits
6. Any complaint must be made in writing by 4.00 p.m. on the first day of the Show
7. Exhibits in Divisions D, E, F, and G must not have been previously shown in the Village Show
8. Exhibitors MUST reside, work or be a member of a club in the Bishopsteignton/Ideford Parish. Spouses/Partners, Children/Grandchildren of Exhibitors are also eligible to exhibit

DIVISION 'A' – Flowers

1. **Dahlia**, any kind, 1 specimen bloom, (not pompon)
2. **Dahlias**, vase of 3 different kinds, (not pompons)
3. **Dahlias**, 3 heads floating in bowl of water
4. **Dahlias**, vase of 3 decorative
5. **Dahlias**, vase of 3 cactus and/or semi-cactus
6. **Dahlias**, vase of 5 blooms, any kind
7. **Rose**, 1 specimen bloom, large flower (HT)
8. **Roses**, vase of 3 blooms, large flower (HT)
9. **Rose**, 1 spray of Cluster-flower (floribunda)
10. **Fuchsias**, 4 heads on a board with stems in water. (double flowering cultivar/s)
11. **Fuchsias**, 4 heads on a board with stems in water. (single flowering cultivar/s)
12. **Chrysanthemums**, 5 stems
13. **Vase of Annuals**, 5 stems, 2 varieties
14. **Penstemons**, vase of 3 stems
15. **Vase of Mixed Garden Flowers (NOT Chrysanthemums)**
16. **Top Vase**. Vase of mixed flowers containing a total of between 5 and 10 stems taken from a minimum of 2 different KINDS of plants. (2 varieties of the same plant/flower are NOT 2 kinds). No accessories allowed; only foliage attached to the stem of each flower will be allowed. No seed heads or berries allowed. **Vase to be viewed from front**. The exhibit will be judged out of a total of 20 points. Condition and quality 8 pts.; colour and texture 6 pts., balance of presentation 6 pts. 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize awards as for Top Tray class 45.
17. **Hydrangeas**, vase of 3 blooms
18. **Shrubs**, Vase of 3 different kinds (need not be in flower)
19. **Gladiolus**, 1 specimen spike
20. **Vase of Perennials**, 5 stems, any variety or varieties
21. **A Cactus or Succulent**, in pot not to exceed 152 mm. (6 ins.) diam.
22. **Geranium/Pelargonium**, in pot not to exceed 200 mm. (8 ins.) diam.
23. **Bonsai exhibit**
24. **An Orchid**, in pot not to exceed 200 mm. (8 ins.) diam.
25. **House plant - foliage**, in pot not to exceed 200 mm. (8 ins.) diam.
26. **House plant – flowering**, in pot not to exceed 200 mm. (8 ins.) diam.

DIVISION 'B' – Fruit and Vegetables

27. **Runner beans**, 9
28. **Onions**, 3 grown from seeds, stands allowed
29. **Onions**, 3, grown from sets, stands allowed
30. **Shallots**, plate of 6, any kind, sand on plate allowed
31. **Potatoes**, 3, round or oval
32. **Beet**, 3 of one variety
33. **Courgettes**, 2 (no larger than 150 mms. [6 ins.] in length)
34. **Tomatoes**, 5, ordinary cultivars
35. **Tomatoes**, 5 of small fruited cultivar
36. **Carrots**, 3 of one variety
37. **Herbs**, fresh, culinary, 3 in water
38. **Any other vegetable**, not enumerated above
39. **Vegetables**, collection of 5 different kinds, one specimen of each
i.e. 1 potato, 1 tomato etc. - stands allowed
40. **Apples**, cooking, 3
41. **Apples**, dessert, 3
42. **Plums**, 3
43. **Raspberries**, 12, with stalks
44. **Fruit**, a plate of any kind not enumerated above
45. **Top Tray**. A display of three types of vegetables from the following list of eight. The points value of each vegetable required for the display is given in the brackets: 3 Carrots (long 20 pts/short 18 pts), 3 Beetroot (long 20 pts/round 15 pts), 3 Onions (20 pts), 3 Parsnips (20 pts), 6 Peas (20 pts), 3 Potatoes (20 pts), 6 Runner Beans (18 pts), 6 Tomatoes (18 pts)
The vegetables are to be displayed within an area of 18 ins. x 24 ins. (45 x 60 cms) without bending any part of them. No part of the exhibit may exceed the size of the tray. Parsley is allowed as a garnish only. Foliage must be trimmed, Onions tied or whipped, stands allowed
Winners are awarded prize money of £5, £3 and £2

DIVISION 'C' – Floral Art – Prize Money 1st - £3; 2nd - £2; 3rd - £1

An Exhibit means plant material with or without accessories. In all classes no artificial plant material may be used unless stated. Artificially coloured plant material may be used unless otherwise stated. Bases, drapes and background may be used.

51. **'Shades of Autumn', Novice class**, an exhibit, width/depth 50 cms. unlimited height
52. **An arrangement in a boot or shoe, 16 yrs. and under – width/depth 50 cms. unlimited height**

54. **Jam** – 1 jar, home-made
55. **Shortbread** – 5 pieces on a plate
56. **Victoria Sponge** – jam filling only – 20cms/8” round tin (3 eggs)
57. **Bread Rolls** – 3 on a plate
58. **Flapjack** – 5 on a plate
59. **Decorated Cup Cakes** – 3 on a plate
60. **Chocolate Chip Muffins** – MEN ONLY – 3 on a plate - given recipe to be used
61. **Savoury Flan** – MEN ONLY – home-made pastry and filling – own recipe

RECIPES - MEN ONLY

CHOCOLATE CHIP MUFFINS, 3 ON A PLATE

Recipe makes 9-12 muffins

200g (7oz) plain flour
30g (1oz) cocoa
Pinch of salt
90g (3oz) soft, light brown sugar
1 level tablespoon baking powder
100g packet plain chocolate chips
90g (3oz) butter, melted
1 medium egg, beaten
175ml (6fl oz) milk
9-12 paper muffin cases
12-hole muffin tray

Method

Set the oven to hot, Gas Mark 6 or 200C/400F
Sift the flour, cocoa, salt, brown sugar and baking powder into a bowl and mix in the chocolate chips. Make a well in the centre, add the melted butter, egg and milk and mix to make a thick batter.
Spoon the mixture into muffin cases.
Bake the muffins in the centre of the oven for 20-25 minutes, until they're well risen and feel springy when lightly pressed.
